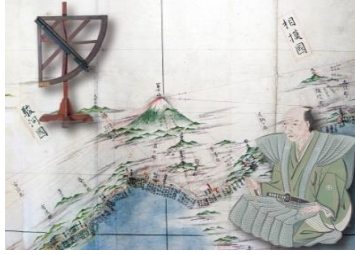

Inoh Tadataka Museum



Sawara was a merchant town where boat transportation along the Tone River flourished. It was so prosperous that a poem read "Come to Sawara if you want to see Edo, because Sawara's Honmachi is even more Edo than Edo." Along the Ono River and Katorikaido the main routes at that time, remain many townhouses, warehouses, western-style houses from the Edo/Meiji/Taisho/Showa periods. Many have continued to operate their family business for generations. Now it's described as a "living townscape."

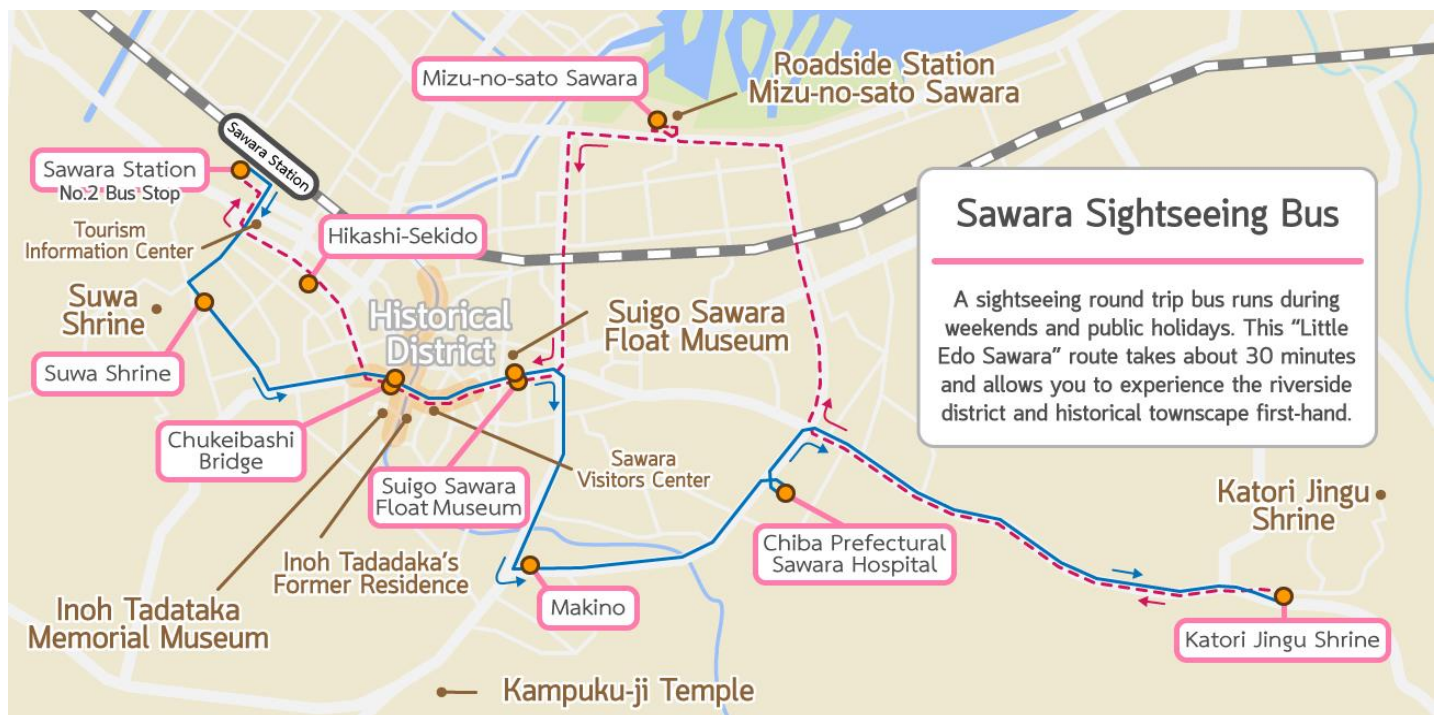
Inoh Tadataka after the age of 50 walked the entirety of Japan, surveying the country and creating the first accurate map of Japan. The Inoh Tadataka Memorial Museum follows Inoh Tadataka's life in Chronological order and introduces all of his achievements. On June 29th 2010 all 2,345 items related to Inoh Tadataka were designated as national treasures of Japan.

Mizu-no-sato Sawara Bus Stop 水の郷さわら 停留所

Suigo Sawara Float Museum



This is a facility that has been designed to familiarise visitors with the traditions and culture of Sawara's floats and music which are nationally designated Important Intangible Folk Cultural Assets, and the culmination of Edo-masari (superior to Edo) culture. The museum introduces the essence of Edo-masari (superior to Edo) culture which has been passed from generation to generation for the past 300 years. Each year the dolls and displays are changed before and after the summer and autumn festivals.

Makino Bus Stop 牧野 停留所

Kampukuji Temple



It's regarded as one of the three great evil-warding daishi temples in Japan, along with Kawasaki Daishi and Nishiarai Daishi. The temple worships Kanon as a guardian Buddha of Taira no Masakado. In the temple, there are 4 gilt bronze made images of Buddha: Ksitigarbha, Shakyamuni, Eleven-faced Kannon, which are important cultural properties. It is also known as the location of Inoh Tadataka's grave. Additionally, Kanpuku-ji Temple is known for its beautiful scenery in all four seasons, with weeping cherry trees in spring, fresh greenery at the start of summer, and autumn leaves in fall.

Katori Jingu Shrine Bus Stop 香取神宮 停留所

Katori Jingu Shrine



Considered one of the most famous shrines in Japan, it's dedicated to the deity Futsunushi no Okami who appears in the myth describing the transfer of a country between Gods. It holds the title of Jingu, which was only given to Ise, Katori and Kashima before the Meiji era. The shrine is also home to a national treasure, the Kaijyu Budokyo, as well as ancient rituals like the Shinko Matsuri and Otaue Matsuri which continue to take place today. The old cedar, cherry, and maple trees are all harmonious with the Gongen-zukuri shrine pavilions.
